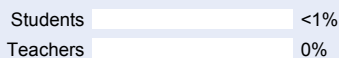

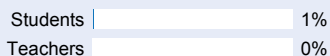

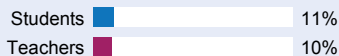

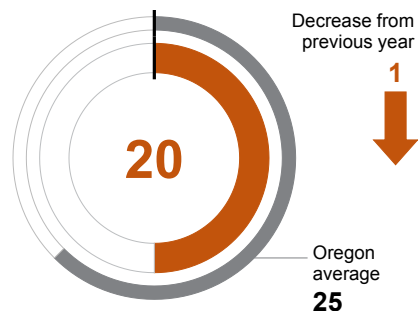

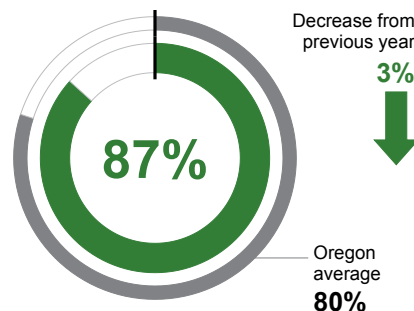
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

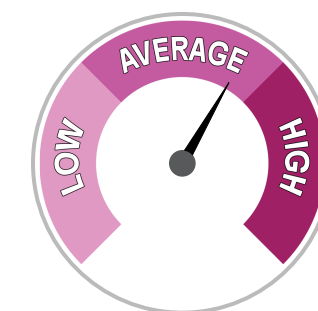
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

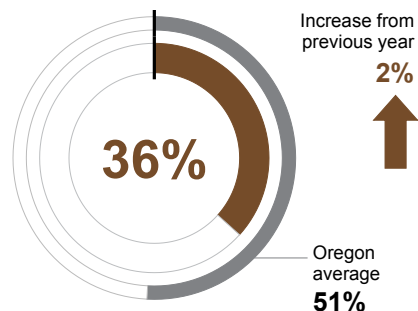
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

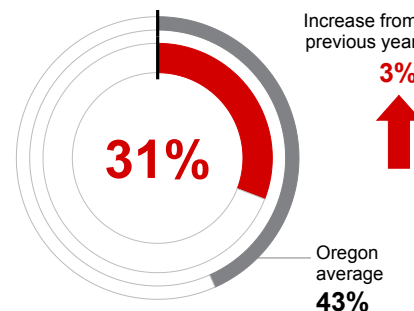
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



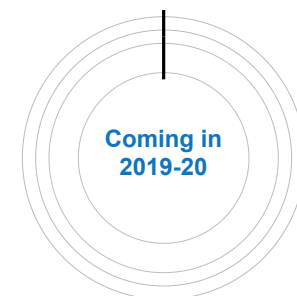
MATHEMATICS

School Goals

Green Elementary School is committed to providing high-quality pre-k through fifth grade educational opportunities to our diverse student body. We achieve our goals through challenging curriculum, quality teachers, supportive principal and an atmosphere that emphasizes communication and cooperation. Together, these four elements create a safe and engaging learning environment which all students can excel.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

We create a safe and caring environment which fosters learning, health and well-being for children and adults. With the addition of a full time PE program and our partnership with the Blue Zone Project, students experience an active and team driven healthy school environment; lowering our chronic non-attendance. In addition, we are addressing student SEL needs through the implementation of Conscious Discipline and the Growing Early Mindsets (GEM) program.

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Green Elementary has a zero tolerance bullying and harassment policy. We address unkind behavior through restorative practices and the use of mentoring programs. Our school's PE teacher organizes structured recess activities focused on teamwork. Students can also utilize one of the two buddy benches or our school garden to include others in recess activities or problem solve misunderstandings. Our school has a CDS (Child Development Specialist) who visits every classroom every six days. She teaches lessons on socio-emotional needs, conducting oneself with integrity and honesty, among many other topics. We have skills groups for students who are struggling, and we employ a number of strategies for connecting adults and students for positive reinforcement.

Parent partnership is a high priority and essential for students success.
